




Fig. 14: Greg Talks on The League of Nations During the War Years

Nelson Mandela Day

In November 2009, the United Nations General Assembly declared July 19 "Nelson Mandela International Day" in recognition of the former South African President's contribution to the culture of peace and freedom. The United Nations recognizes Nelson Mandela's values and his dedication to the service of humanity in the fields of conflict resolution, race relations, the promotion and protection of human rights, reconciliation, gender equality and the rights of children and other vulnerable groups, as well as the support of poor and underdeveloped communities. It acknowledges his contribution to the struggle for democracy internationally and the promotion of a culture of peace throughout the world.

UNPA pays tribute to Nelson Mandela and his 100th birthday with this CHF 2.00 stamp illustrated by the famous artist Martin Mörck. The quote on the stamp reads "*It is easy to break down and destroy. The heroes are those who make peace and build*" in French.

WORLD DAY AGAINST TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS Vienna special event sheet

On July 30, 2018, UNPA issued a special event sheet on the World Day Against Trafficking in Persons to raise awareness about Human Trafficking. The sheet in the denomination of \notin 0,80 contains ten stamps with the United Nations emblem.

Human trafficking is the use of force, fraud or deception to gain power over people with the aim of exploiting them. Human trafficking is a crime that hurts women, children and men for numerous purposes, including forced labor and sex. The International Labor Organization estimates that 21 million people are victims of forced labor globally. This estimate also includes victims of human trafficking for labor and sexual exploitation. While it is not known how many of these victims were trafficked, the estimate implies that currently, there are millions of trafficking victims in the world.

Virtually every country in the world is affected by these crimes, whether as a country of origin, transit or destination for victims. Children make up almost a third of all human trafficking victims worldwide, according to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime Global Report on Trafficking in Persons. Additionally, women and girls comprise 71 per cent of human trafficking victims, the report states.

The challenge for all countries, rich and poor, is to target the criminals who exploit desperate people and to protect and assist victims of trafficking and smuggled migrants, many of whom endure unimaginable hardships in their bid for a better life.

The Blue Heart Campaign is a global awareness raising initiative to fight human trafficking and its impact on society. It seeks to encourage involvement from governments, civil society, the corporate sector and individuals alike, to inspire action and help prevent this heinous crime.





A History of UN Collecting - UN Clubs, Part 4

In the Spring of 1963 a group of avid UN Collectors in the New York Metropolitan area met at a local stamp show and discussed the possibility of forming a National UN Collector Organization here in the United States. The effort, led by Mr. Martin Hoff, of Brooklyn, New York, culminated in the formation of the United Nations Study Unit (UNSU) of the American Topical Association as chartered on September 10, 1963. During the early years the club issued a nice paper membership card (Figure 1).

The first recognized newsletter of the club was published in October – November 1963 (Figure 2). The

Bulletin was three pages, mimeographed, and covered the then-current issues as well as a special release of UNTEA stamps. About 5 years later the club began issuing the Bulletin in a smaller format which continued for nearly 20 years (Figure 3).




Figure 4: Special Cover for UNSU 5th Anniversary






Figure 5: Special cover for UNSU 10th Anniversary

In addition to the Bulletin, the UNSU was very active at local, regional and even some national stamp exhibitions. Record of their show participation included some very nice commemorative covers, souvenir cards, as well as special commemorative imprints (Figures 4, 5, 6, 7, 8).




Figure 12: Otto Wolke's First Issue Study

I have several nice covers from the organization over the years, both small and large for various correspondence from the club. The corner cards changed on occasion as did the return addresses of the club Secretaries. Notable among them were Marty Hoff, Keith Blunt, and Dieter Kist (Figures 9, 10, 11, 12). On a personal note, I joined UNSU in the Fall of 1973, as a twelve year old junior collector. I recall meeting and talking to Paul Kravitz and Ron Ginns at the UNSU booth at the old LISDA show at the Long Island Coliseum, and having them excite me with the prospects of traveling to New York City monthly for club meetings at the Sloan House YMCA and later at the New York Collectors Club. Those meeting were full of new discoveries, wonderful conversations, and some ground breaking research. One such example was the publishing of Otto Wolke's first definitive study. I knew Otto personally and he was gracious enough to sign my copy of his work (Figures 12, 13).

In addition to the great material our club events often included special guests and dignitaries. Here is a wonderful vintage photo of Richard Bereson (Founder of the Club of UN Collectors), Dr. Bertram Schaffner (then President of the UNSU), Paul Voutsinas, and Rene Gavard, both Chief 's of the UNPA. (Figure 14).

In the Early 1980's the UNSU stopped producing the Bulletin and no longer held monthly meetings in NYC. There was some effort to continue the club thereafter but there was not enough members willing to take on leadership roles to make it come to fruition. Most of the previous club executive commit-

TOWARDS UNITED NATIONS

THE FIVE CENT COMMEMORATIVE ISSUE OF 1945, PART 1

By Fran Adams (Adapted from his Single Frame Exhibit)

Exhibit Focus

This special study documents the stamp issue's design and postal use. Material is organized to present examples from the production process, followed by domestic destinations and postal services, further subdivided by rates in chronological order (rate table) and international destinations by continent.

Examples of all rate types are included. United Nations related origins or end destinations as well as covers with multiple franking of the stamp are preferred.

Historical Background

In 1943, President Franklin D. Roosevelt championed a new world peace organization to replace the League of Nations. World nations agreed to an international conference to be held in San Francisco and a postage stamp issue was planned to commemorate the event. Intended as a postal ambassador for the fledgling organization, the stamp was assigned a 5¢ value, the first class surface rate to foreign destinations.

Various designs were rejected and on 3 April, Roosevelt suggested the wording "Toward United Nations, April 25, 1945", with a simple border and the words over a laurel branch. Roosevelt died two weeks before the conference began and the Bureau of Engraving and Printing added his name to the design as the quote's author.

Postal significance of this stamp bears special mention for its impact on publicizing the formation of an international organization seeking peace for mankind. No single nation's issue compares to the social message of this simple design.





Photo essay of unaccepted design *Two reported examples*

President Roosevelt and Postmaster General Walker, produced a simple design - the words "Toward United Nations - April 25 1945" over a laurel branch. The Bureau added Roosevelt's name as the author of the quote in his memory.




